STRONGEST FIELD IN TOURNAMENT HISTORY SET FOR 2025 3M OPEN

Major Champions, Top 50 Players, and Exciting Young Talent Headline This Week's Action at TPC Twin Cities

BLAINE, MN – The 3M Open returns to TPC Twin Cities in Blaine, Minnesota this week, July 21–27, with the strongest field in tournament history set to compete at Minnesota's only PGA TOUR stop.

The 156-player field includes 11 of the top 50 players in the Official World Golf Ranking and 23 of the top 50 finishers from the 2024 FedExCup standings. Among the committed players are 50 PGA TOUR winners from the past two seasons—including five already victorious in 2025—and a compelling mix of major champions, former 3M Open winners, and rising stars.

Returning to defend his title is Jhonattan Vegas, joined by fellow past champions Lee Hodges (2023), Tony Finau (2022) and Cameron Champ (2021).

"The strength and depth of this year's field reflect how far the 3M Open has come in just a few short years," said Mike Welch, 3M Open Tournament Director. "We're thrilled to welcome some of the biggest names in golf, exciting young players making their TOUR debuts, and a strong Minnesota presence. It's going to be a memorable week for fans."

MAJOR CHAMPIONS & TOUR WINNERS HEADLINE THE FIELD

This year's field boasts multiple major champions, including: **U.S. Open winners**: Wyndham Clark (2023), Gary Woodland (2019), Webb Simpson (2012); **Masters Tournament winners**: Danny Willett (2016), Adam Scott (2013), Zach Johnson (2007) and **The Open Championship winner**: Zach Johnson (2015), as well as **THE PLAYERS champions**: Webb Simpson (2018), Si Woo Kim (2017), Rickie Fowler (2015), Adam Scott (2004).

Other notable **2025 PGA TOUR winners** in the field include Chris Gotterup, Joe Highsmith, William Mouw, Garrick Higgo, and Karl Vilips.

Fan favorites such as Max Homa, Sam Burns, Tom Kim, Joel Dahmen, Akshay Bhatia, Sahith Theegala, and Maverick McNealy add further star power.

Following his top-10 finish at The Open Championship, **Haotong Li** has officially joined the 2025 3M Open field. Li fired a final-round 70 on Sunday at Royal Portrush to finish 11-under for the tournament, earning a share of fourth place alongside Wyndham Clark and Matt Fitzpatrick.
