Michael Kim (1st/-14)

- **12-under 59 in the second round marks the 16th sub-60 score in PGA TOUR history**
- 15th different player (16th time) to shoot a sub-60 round on TOUR; Jim Furyk is the only player with two sub-60 rounds
- First sub-60 score on TOUR since Jake Knapp (59/R1) at the 2025 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches (512 days ago)
- Kim's previous career low on TOUR was 62 (three times, most recent: 2026 RBC Heritage/R4)
- Lowest 18-hole score in 3M Open history (previous best: 60, Adam Svensson/2025/R1, Kurt Kitayama/2025/R3)
- Lowest 18-hole score on TOUR this season (previous best: 60, five times: Scottie Scheffler/Travelers Championship, Wyndham Clark/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, Si Woo Kim/ THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, Andrew Putnam/The American Express, Blades Brown/The American Express)

- Third-round 59 consisted of 12 birdies, one shy of tying the PGA TOUR record for most in a round (Adam Hadwin/2017 American Express, Chip Beck/1991 Shriners Children's Open)
- Recorded 21 putts and 145' 4" of putts made, including eight of 10+ feet, highlighted by a 24' 4" birdie putt on his final hole (No. 18)
- Gained 10.882 strokes on the field in the second round and led all players in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (4.204), Strokes Gained: Putting (6.524), Proximity (21' 4") and fewest putts (21)
- Prior to today, recorded just three scores in the 60s in 13 career rounds at TPC Twin Cities (previous best: 67/2021/R2)
- In five prior starts in the 3M Open, recorded just one made cut (T39/2021)
- Earns his second 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and first since the 2018 John Deere Classic which he went on to win
- In his 11th season on TOUR, seeking his second PGA TOUR title in his 275th career start

- Finished 31st in the 2025 FedExCup standings (career best)
- Entered this week No. 65 in the FedExCup standings with one top-10 finish in 21 starts this season (T2/Valero Texas Open)

Additional player notes

- In the seven years of the 3M Open, only two players who held the 36-hole lead/co-lead have gone on to win (Lee Hodges/2023, Michael Thompson/2020); on TOUR this season, 10 of the 30 individual-stroke play events were won by players with the 36-hole lead/co-lead (most recent: Tom Kim/Genesis Scottish Open)
- 18-hole leader **Ben Kohles** (T2/-11) follows his career-low 62 with a second-round 69 and sits inside the top five after 36 holes for the second time in his last three starts (T4 after two rounds at 2026 John Deere Classic, finished T3); five-time Korn Ferry Tour winner seeks his first PGA TOUR title in his 122nd career start
- With rounds of 64 and 67, **Emiliano Grillo** (T2/-11) records his best 36-hole score of the season (131); in his seventh appearance at the 3M Open, owns three top-10 finishes at TPC Twin Cities (T3/2020, T2/2022, T10/2023); in his 288th career start, seeks his third PGA TOUR title (2015 Procore Championship, 2023 Charles Schwab Challenge)
- **Chandler Phillips** (T2/-11) leads all players through 36 holes in Strokes Gained: Around the Green (3.648) and ranks second in Strokes Gained: Putting (5.844); third-year PGA TOUR member seeks his first win in his 78th career start
- Phillips and **Troy Merritt** (T5/-10) are the only players to record scores of 66 or better in each of the first two rounds
- In his 13th start on TOUR, **Jackson Koivun** (T5/-10) sits inside the top-10 heading into the weekend for the second time and first since the 2025 Procore Championship (T2 after 36 holes, finished T4)
- Four-time TOUR winner **Brian Harman** (T7/-9) birdies five of his final eight holes for a bogey-free 64; one top-10 in two prior starts in the 3M Open (T7/2019); best finish in 20 starts this season is T11 at THE PLAYERS Championship
- World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T13/-7) follows his first-round 65 with a 1-under 70 via four birdies against one bogey (par-3 17th) and one double bogey (par-4 16th); through two rounds, ranks 133rd in Strokes Gained: Around the Green (-1.979)
 - Currently seven shots back, Scheffler has three wins on TOUR after overcoming a deficit of 7+ strokes after two rounds: 2022 WM Phoenix Open (nine back, won in a playoff), 2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (eight back, won by one), 2025 Procore Championship (eight back, won by one)
- In his PGA TOUR debut, Minnesota native **Muzzy Donohue** (T24/-6) cards an 8-under 63, the second-lowest score Friday, only behind Michael Kim's 59; 25-year-old Boston College product won the 109th Minnesota State Open two weeks ago; one prior PGA TOUR-sanctioned start came on PGA TOUR Americas in 2025 (missed cut)
- **Kurt Kitayama** (T31/-5) sits nine back in his attempt to become the first player to successfully defend at the 3M Open
- **Mackenzie Hughes** (T41/-4) played his final 10 holes of the second round in 7-under to secure a made cut
