Jackson Koivun (1st/-25)

- Earns his first PGA TOUR title in his 13th career start (third as a professional) at the age of 21 years, 2 months, 3 days
- Entered the final round with a three-stroke lead and cards a bogey-free 66 to claim the three-stroke win
- Youngest player to win on TOUR since Aldrich Potgieter (20 years, 9 months, 16 days) at the 2025 Rocket Classic
- Youngest American player to win a PGA TOUR event by multiple strokes since the 1932 WM Phoenix Open (Ralph Guldahl)

- Sets the 72-hole tournament scoring record for the 3M Open, topping Lee Hodges' 260 (-24) in 2023
- Bogey free in three of four rounds this week (R1/64, R3/61, R4/66)
- Led the field this week in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (9.363) and proximity to the hole (27' 8"), while ranking third in both Strokes Gained: Putting (6.395) and Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (10.640)

- Fourth rookie to win on TOUR this season, joining Alex Fitzpatrick (Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with Matt Fitzpatrick), Kristoffer Reitan (Truist Championship) and Stefano Mazzoli (Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Third player this season to secure his first PGA TOUR title within his first 13 starts on TOUR, joining Alex Fitzpatrick (11th TOUR start at Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with Matt Fitzpatrick) and Stefano Mazzoli (3rd TOUR start at Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Earns 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 70 in the standings after entering the week No. 194
- Former No. 1 ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking turned professional last month, accepting PGA TOUR membership via PGA TOUR University Accelerated; became the third player to earn a TOUR card through the Accelerated program, joining Vanderbilt's Gordon Sargent and Florida State's Luke Clanton
 - Had the option to accept PGA TOUR membership in June 2025 but opted to return to Auburn for his 2025-26 junior season
 - Finished his college career with 42 points in PGA TOUR University Accelerated, more than double the 20-point threshold needed to earn a PGA TOUR card
- Prior to turning professional, spent 56 consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 in World Amateur Golf Ranking, the third-longest reign in history, only behind Keita Nakajima (87 weeks) and Jon Rahm (60 weeks)
- Made 10 starts as an amateur on TOUR, which included a stretch of four consecutive finishes of T11 or better (2025 John Deere Classic/T11, 2025 ISCO Championship/T6, 2025 Wyndham Championship/T5, 2025 Procore Championship/T4)
- Led Auburn to team national titles at the 2024 and 2026 NCAA Championships and finished his collegiate career with 11 wins, which ranks first in Auburn history, tied for first in SEC history, and tied for seventh in NCAA history
- Became the first player in collegiate golf history to win all three Player of the Year awards (Haskins, Hogan, Nicklaus) twice – first as a freshman in 2024 and again as a junior in 2026

Additional player notes

- **Scottie Scheffler** (2nd/-22) entered the final-round six shots and cards a bogey-free 63 to finish solo-second, his fifth runner-up finish this season; marks his 15th runner-up and 87th top-10 in 167 career starts on TOUR; 2026 FedExCup leader increases his lead in the standings, 794 points ahead of Matt Fitzpatrick; leads all players with 11 top-five finishes this season (next best: 7, Matt Fitzpatrick)
- **Hideki Matsuyama** (T3/-20) followed his first-round 70 with rounds of 65-65-64 to clinch his third top-10 finish of the season (P2/WM Phoenix Open, T3/3M Open, T8/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am); cards a 6-under 30 on the back nine in the final round, highlighted by a birdie-eagle finish on Nos. 17-18; led the field this week in Strokes Gained: Around the Green with (8.170)
- After bogeying the final hole of the first round, **Brian Harman** (T3/-20) played the final 54 holes bogey free to earn his first top-10 since the 2025 Open Championship (T10); ranked second this week in Strokes Gained: Around the Green (4.664)
- **Chandler Phillips** (T3/-20) records his best finish of the season and climbs from 103rd to 86th in the FedExCup standings
- **Denny McCarthy** (T3/-20) birdies three of his final four holes and earns his best finish on TOUR since the 2024 Valero Texas Open (2nd); led all players this week in Strokes Gained: Putting (7.482)
- **Michael Kim** (T10/-17) followed his second-round 59 with rounds of 69 and 70 to secure his second top-10 this season and first since the Valero Texas Open (T2)
- **Jake Knapp** (T13/-16) cards the low round of the day with a 9-under 62, including an 8-under 28 on the back nine, tying his low round this season (Texas Children's Houston Open/R4); birdied eight of the his final nine holes (only par came at par-3 17th)
- **Kurt Kitayama** (-13) finishes T24 in his bid to become the first player to successfully defend at the 3M Open
